2025 Inspiring Unity Scholarship



The Inspiring Unity Scholarship was created in 2023 in remembrance of three (3) members of Buffalo Metropolitan Federal Credit Union, **Katherine Massey, Aaron Salter, and Ruth Whitfield**, who were tragically killed in the Buffalo New York mass shooting on May 14th, 2022. All three were outstanding citizens who advocated for unity in Buffalo and the ongoing education of Buffalo's youth.

Buffalo Metropolitan Federal Credit Union is dedicated to helping our youth in the Buffalo Community to attend and succeed in the educational arena. Buffalo Metropolitan Federal Credit Union facilitates partnerships with key stakeholders like Gems & Jewels Multi-Cultural Empowerment Center (GJMEC) to increase academic achievement of Youth in our Buffalo Communities.

The Award

Buffalo Metropolitan Federal Credit Union awards three (3) \$1,000.00 scholarships to be paid jointly to the student and the educational institution. There will be no exceptions. The funds may be used towards tuition, room and board, books, school supplies, etc.

Eligibility

The applicant must be a member, in good standing, with Buffalo Metropolitan Federal Credit Union who meets all of the following criteria:

- High School Senior who resides in Erie County, NY.
- Member of Buffalo Metropolitan Federal Credit Union.
- Applicant must be a graduating high school senior in the year of the award.
- Applicant must have at least a 2.0 grade point average or a (C average minimum).
- Applicant must demonstrate Community Involvement, Improvement in academics, and desire to attend college.
- Applicants must show 10-20 hours of community activity/volunteer work in underserved areas.
- May not be related to any board of director or staff.
- Applicant must be willing to attend a scholarship check presentation/award ceremony with the Buffalo Metropolitan Federal Credit Union & Gems & Jewels Multi-Cultural Empowerment Center if selected as a winner.



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Application Process

To apply, eligible members must complete the scholarship application form and essay. As well as submitting all other forms required.

✓ Check box after completing each step.

- Complete Scholarship Application.
- High School Transcript documenting students GPA for grades 9-11.
- Completed essay response.
- Two (2) Letters of Recommendation (At least 1 letter should be from the school, teacher etc.).
- The applicant and his/her parent or guardian must complete the Certification and Release Authorization on the last page of the application form.
- The application, transcripts and essay must be submitted to **Buffalo Metropolitan Federal Credit Union by January 31, 2025. If any portion is incomplete or missing, the application will not be considered.**

Selection Process

Judging will be based on both subjective criteria and weighted, objective criteria. These include academic achievements, extracurricular activities, essay, etc.

Applications must be submitted to Buffalo Metropolitan Federal Credit Union by **January 31, 2025.**

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What You Should know Check List

- 1) When you apply for a scholarship, you should have the academic credentials to back it up. The proof should start with the application you need to create an impressive and superior application. This should reflect your own credentials and personality.
- 2) An effective scholarship application should contain important details as well as its physical presentation. Remember, first impressions matter and this starts as soon as the reader opens your cover letter.
- 3) The application is normally sent to a committee who should do the evaluation if you should qualify for a scholarship. How you word your application at this stage is very important.
- 4) Any flaws will cause the sponsor to just throw away your request. Don't resort to long narrative and irrelevant details. The most effective applications are simple, easy to read, short, and lucid. Every item should be well-researched and thorough.
- 5) Universities and social organizations offer a huge range of scholarship opportunities. The majority of scholarships usually cover tuition fees; this leads the student to the responsibility for their own living expenses.
